




Message from Vice President


University Branches Building Resource

Cabinent Appointments, a Display of lack of Nationalism

We are yet entering the era of governance by the NRM Party under the leadership of President Museveni the huge cabinet carries an executive membership of close 7069 Ministers. In short such a meeting of the big men can be construed to depict a political rally and not an executive meeting.

In the 1990's when asked why he possesses the biggest cabinet in Africa, he answered that he has the biggest number of problems. By this answer the implication is that every problem carries a Minister; I once mused to residents of Karerwe who have occasionally suffered floods that the President shall create a Ministry in charge of Kalerwe floods. Of course here the President has failed in his duty of Managing the scarce resources of Uganda to the extent that everybody is poor and all those working with him are rich. It should not have taken every village a Ministerial appointment for that village to support the NRM or to achieve development for that matter. A Nationalist Cabinet of even 10 Ministers in so far as the same is deemed Nationalistic can serve a small country like Uganda with a population of only 26 million people. Kenya, with an outlet to the sea with an enviably coastal economy and a sound industrial base, with a population of close to 34 million people at least according to the Bomas Constitutional amendments, the President has only 20 Ministers and 20 deputies.

South Africa, with a population of 42 million people and with a purchasing power parity of 500 billion dollars has only 28 ministers and 21 deputies despite a solid economy barked by minerals. Ghana according to article 76 of the Constitution of Ghana (1992) provides for 19 ministers. All these countries have a history of war, populations and tribes but are meagre with ministerial appointments. Appointments mean public expenditure more taxes, less savings and thus less investments leading to poverty. The real problem is the lack of a National Spirit and this was born by the NRM's principle of individual merit. This meant that you are not part unless you are there in fact what the President has is a huge cabinet which can be christened King size if I may borrow the FIJI interpretation, the same way every village is seeking to be declared a district, now every household seeks to produce a minister if they are to develop. This is a display of mistrust in the current government by the people. In Luganda we have a saying

that "eyeetuukidde tanywa matabangufu" that he who attends in person gets first class milk. This is the way forward for Ugandans, at least according to them.

Such situations develop when a leader is seen as propelling a cause of either his own tribe or family, the people cease to believe in him as their Leader but a representative of those near him in form of region, religion, tribe or family, the others feel comfortable when they each send their own also to the front desk. Well, I don't blame him for having failed to lead us, my blame is that he still insists he can lead any more.

Obafemi Awolowo of Nigeria had the same problem where when he thought he was agitating against poverty and unemployment, he looked back at the Crowd following him amongst whom were both the rich and the poor, little did he know that they followed him not because they were poor but because they were his fellow Yoruba tribesmen. The late Oginga Odinga, once on the streets for the causes above, had only his fellow Luo following him rich and poor.

Today, the 70 ministers cannot even be identified by the people they claim to serve. The former regimes however had a subject called civics where students would study matters of governance. They would study names of ministers and would know them by finger tips. Now no sooner will the teacher have organised a full lesson than such ministers are sacked.

I am therefore not an active enthusiast of the coming cabinet and to expect them to deliver is to measure the depth of a pond but by using your two feet. That is a very dangerous level of determination, fool hardy and not my type. I implore you all young democrats to therefore work hard for the next Uganda. Mark all the deficiencies because those will be our pre-occupation the years to come. Thank you,

This is the second part of the DP's long walk to Justice. In the last update we saw the levels of education standards of the founders of the Democratic Party now we are looking at the announcement of the formation of the Democratic Party.

The formation of the Democratic Party was announced on the 6th of October, 1954 with Joseph Kasolo as its first President. It is only in August 1956 that the Party got a truly National Executive Committee led by Matayo Mugwanya and premises for its headquarters at Katwe.

On the 25th August, 1956, a Mammoth rally was staged at Nakivubo car park and the objectives of the party were announced. These were:-

•To furnish the country with people who could work in the interests of the masses in the legislative council, to fight It is also then that the Party Motto of "Truth and Justice" was formally adopted.

So were the party flag colours of white and green unfurled with white representing perseverance and green hope. The leadership realized then that independence was a long term objective which had to be planned for. At that time, the legislative council was dominated by White and Asian nominees, there were just a few nominated Africans. There were hardly Africans in the Civil Service
